

A. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND ROLL CALL

President Atkins called the regular meeting to order at 12:30 p.m., and Director McGurk led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present at roll call at the District were Directors Atkins, Cortopassi, McGaughey, McGurk, Panizza, Sanguinetti and Watkins. Also present were Manager Hopkins, Assistant Manager Vega, District Engineer Evensen, Finance Director Ram, Administrative Assistant McKinney, Legal Counsel Zolezzi and Consultant Barkett was present via teleconference.

1. Minutes 01/03/23 Regular Meeting

Director Cortopassi made the following correction to the minutes:

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the January 3, 2023 Regular Board Meeting Minutes, with corrections.

2. Warrants – California Public Employees' Retirement System

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the January 10, 2023 Warrants, as presented.

3. San Joaquin County General Election

Manager Hopkins provided the Board with a listing of the Official Final Results of the Stockton East Water District's local representatives at the county, state and federal level who were elected or reelected on November 8, 2022. Manager Hopkins reported last week the Board recommended the District send congratulation letters to the newly elected officials. If the Board is amendable, the District will have the letters signed.

Director Watkins stated there should be three Council Members listed for the City of Stockton. If the members won by 50% in the June primaries, they were automatically elected and were not listed on

the November ballot. Director Panizza replied there are seven members with a staggered election (4 at one time, 3 another). City of Stockton Council Members to be added are Michael Blower (District 3) and Brando Villapudua (District 5).

Director McGurk stated Senator Alex Padilla is the California state representative to the United States Senate. Director McGurk suggested for State support efforts, a congratulatory letter be sent to Congressmember John Duarte. Director Sanguinetti suggested a letter be sent to Governor Newsom. Manager Hopkins stated the letters will be prepared for President Atkins signature.

4. Stockton East Water District – Board Committees and Assignments.

Manager Hopkins reported that on December 13, 2022 at the Special Reorganizational Board Meeting, the General Manager was directed to research the District's committees and assignments to determine if all the committees were still applicable, and make recommendations on any changes. Subsequent to this direction, there was an inquiry regarding the ability of the Board President to create committees and appoint committee members. Manager Hopkins discussed Legal Counsel Zolezzi's opinion, which allows the Board President the authority to create new committees and appoint all the members except for the standing committees which the Board created through resolution. Manager Hopkins reviewed the list of current standing and ad hoc committees along with notes that describe the reasoning for creation of each committee. Manager Hopkins stated in the Board memo (page 11), there are Staff recommendations to dissolve the committees that seem to be no longer serving any purpose.

Director Watkins suggested approval to delete the Calaveras County Water District Joint Committee. Director Panizza asked if Rule 131 was settled. Manager Hopkins replied the Rule 131 Committee met, there were changes to Rule 131 proposed by District Staff, and the Committee provided feedback which has not been brought back for acceptance or recommendation to the Board for revisions. Assistant Manager Vega agreed with the outstanding revisions.

Director McGaughey stated Legal Counsel Zolezzi is listed under the committee members list. Director Watkins replied Legal Counsel Zolezzi is appointed as staff to several committees.

Director Panizza suggesting moving forward with District Staff recommendations to dissolve the committees listed.

President Atkins stated Director Sanguinetti should be removed from the Central & SEWD Ad Hoc Committee as there is a possible conflict of interest.

Manager Hopkins stated the Board Committees and Assignments list will be updated with the changes discussed.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 01/02/23 Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 170,032 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 1,611 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 2,367 cfs and release to all water users are set at 0 cfs. There are 0 irrigators on New Hogan, 0 irrigators on New Melones, and 0 irrigators out of District. The water treatment plant is currently processing 20 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 0 mgd. Manager Hopkins reported the District wells total water extraction is 6,635 gpm (~9.6 mgd).

Director Cortopassi asked why the release to Stanislaus River flow is much greater than the release from New Melones. Manager Hopkins stated that Tulloch is showing an inflow of 1,900 CFS with a small inflow that is downstream of Tulloch and upstream of Goodwin.

2. Information Items:

Manager Hopkins noted item: F2a-1

Director McGurk asked why only four counties were mentioned in the public notice. Director Watkins suggested it could have been a mistake unless a county dropped out.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins reported the District's Internet went down today due to damage of the AT&T lines. Fortunately, StarLink picked up the Internet, and the District was able to maintain service. The email service had to be restored, and services are being performed to connect and receive outside phone calls. Manager Hopkins reported a scheduled shutdown for the water treatment plant is set for January 18th. This shutdown is necessary to perform work for the Sodium Hypochlorite project, and to make improvements to Switchgear B on High Service Pump Station for the future automatic transfer switch. This improvement has been discussed with the Urban Contractors, who agreed with the shutdown date. Manager Hopkins reported he was contacted by the Sierra Network representative from the California Special Districts Association (CSDA) attempting to schedule a meeting with Representative Harder and several special districts in this area for a 5-7-minute presentation from the districts. Manager Hopkins advised the District's interest, and reported the potential meeting dates are February 14-16th. Confirmation of the meeting date will follow. Manager Hopkins stated following discussion with Consultant Barkett regarding the DC trip for the week of March 13th; participant attendees for the trip need to be confirmed. The Board Members interested in attending are Director Sanguinetti and Director Watkins.

Re: Bellota Pipeline Intake Structure Fish Screens Retrofit

Background

As a part of the Stockton East Water District's (District) fiscal year 2023-2024 (FY 23-24) budget, the Board of Directors (Board) approved a \$200,000 budget to retrofit the two existing fish screens at the Bellota Pipeline Intake Structure. The mechanical parts of the existing fish screens have exceeded their life expectancy and replacement parts are no longer available. Staff used the last spares from the manufacturer's storage to repair one of the units earlier this fiscal year. The existing fish screens utilize a hydraulic actuator to drive the brush cleaning system, and the brushes and drive units on the screens are beyond repair. The existing screens and frames are in good condition and do not need any repairs at this time.

Summary

Staff received a quote from the original manufacturer of the screens, Intake Screens, Inc., for the mechanical retrofit of the existing screens. The retrofit quote replaces the hydraulic drives with electric drives, brush assemblies, and a new control panel. Also included is the removal of the screens and associated hydraulic equipment and installation after the retrofit is complete. The total quoted amount for the retrofit of the fish screens is \$172,150, including taxes and shipping.


Replacement of the mechanical screen parts would be preferred immediately at the start of next fiscal year and prior to increasing spring demands for at least one functioning screen. Staff would like Board approval to order the screen retrofit now and prepare for the installation in early April 2023.

Financial

This project is budgeted for \$200,000 in FY 23-24 and there is sufficient lead time to ensure delivery next fiscal year and meet an install date of early April. Staff recommends ordering the screen retrofit now for delivery and installation in FY 23-24. The recommended quote of \$172,150 is below the budgeted amount and the remainder will be sufficient funding for installation of electrical components.

Recommendations

District staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to proceed with the purchase of the Intake Screens, Inc. retrofit of the Bellota Pipeline Intake Structure Fish Screens in the amount of \$172,150, plus a 10% contingency, for a total approved amount of \$189,365, and make all other necessary approvals.




