

A. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE AND ROLL CALL

President Watkins called the regular meeting to order at 12:30 p.m., and Director McGurk led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present at roll call at the District were Directors Atkins, Cortopassi, McGaughey, McGurk, Panizza, Sanguinetti and Watkins. Also present were Interim Manager Hopkins, District Engineer Evensen, Administrative Services Manager Carido, Accountant Ram and Legal Counsel Zolezzi.

1. Minutes 06/07/22 Regular Meeting

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the June 7, 2022 Regular Board Meeting minutes, as presented.

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the June 14, 2022 Warrants – California Public Employees’ Retirement System, as presented.

3. Resolution No. 22-23-04 – Authorization To File A Grant Application With The Department Of Interior United States Bureau Of Reclamation For The WaterSMART: Drought Resiliency Projects (Funding No. R23AS00005) For Fiscal Year 2023, Execute Any Required Documents and Provide Delegation of Authority

Interim Manager Hopkins provided the Board with Resolution No. 22-23-04. Interim Manager Hopkins reported there is funding in the current fiscal year for design and to start construction of a new extraction well on the Water Treatment Plant campus. Additionally, there is a new grant funding available from the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation under the Drought Response Program that will fund drought response measures such as aquifer storage and recovery wells. Interim Manager Hopkins reported staff is proposing to apply for the grant to match our funding which can then fund construction of an aquifer storage and recovery well that will allow the District to put water

into the ground when we have it, and draw it back out when we need it. Director Cortopassi inquired how the water will be put into the ground. President Watkins replied down the well. Director McGurk asked if staff has a location identified. Interim Manager Hopkins replied somewhere on this campus. District Engineer Evensen commented proposing to construct near the North Pond, just south of where the two existing irrigation pumps are located. District Engineer Evensen reported this location is close to where it needs to be discharged and not too far away to get potable water that will need to be dechlorinated before it is injected into the groundwater. District Engineer reported on flows of ~4,000 gpm. Director Cortopassi inquired for clarification if chlorinated water is going to be used. President Watkins replied we will use treated surface water after it has been dechlorinated. Director Atkins inquired if this was a 50/50 grant. Interim Manager Hopkins replied yes. Director McGurk inquired on the depth of the proposed aquifer storage and recovery well, specifically if it will be deeper than the typical percolation. President Watkins replied it will be different aquifer.

4. Dr. Joe Waidhofer Drinking Water Treatment Plant – Sodium Hypochlorite Project Monthly Update

Interim Manager Hopkins provided the Board with a picture presentation on the status of the Sodium Hypochlorite Project. District Engineer Evensen reported the construction progress is going well and provided an update of the project progress that included identifying underground utilities; developing the construction access road south of the Administration Building; excavation of the foundation for the hypochlorite tank storage building; noting pouring the foundation this Friday. District Engineer also reported on District staff locating the 8-inch utility waterline running between the sedimentation basin and filter building. District Engineer Evensen mentioned that everything is going great and the soil density test results have come back and they have all passed. Director McGurk inquired if the rebar was tested. District Engineer Evensen replied yes and that Terracon is under contract for materials testing. This item was for information only.

5. Stockton East Water District – Adopting Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (Exhibit A)

Interim Manager Hopkins provided the Board Adopting Appropriations Limit for Fiscal Year 2022-2023 (Exhibit A). Interim Manager Hopkins reported this is just the announcement and will bring the Resolution with Exhibit A back to the Board on July 5th for consideration and approval. This information has to be made available to the public 15-days prior to the meeting establishing the Limit for any public comment. This item was for information only.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. San Joaquin County & Delta Water Quality Coalition Meeting, 06/13/22
This meeting was cancelled.

2. Stockton East Water District Ad-Hoc Committee Meeting – Staffing, 06/13/22
Directors Panizza, Sanguinetti and Watkins attended the June 13, 2022 Stockton East Water District Ad-Hoc Committee Meeting. President Watkins reported the Committee met and reviewed the submittals; and, reported bringing back to the Board at a later date.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 06/06/22

Interim Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 113,652 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 247 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 1,851 cfs and release to all water users are set at 0 cfs. There are 14 irrigators on New Hogan. The water treatment plant is currently processing 52 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 13 mgd. Interim Manager Hopkins reported the District Wells total water extraction is 4,612 gpm (~6.91 mgd).

2. Information Items:

Interim Manager Hopkins noted item: F2a-1, F2a-2, F2a-3, F2a-4 and F2a-5.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

- a. California State Assembly Local Government Committee Hearing – SB656 (Eggman), 06/08/22

Interim Manager Hopkins and Legal Counsel Zolezzi attended the June 8, 2022 California State Assembly Local Government Committee Hearing. Interim Manager Hopkins reported Legislation was presented by Senator Eggman and Legal Counsel Zolezzi provided testimony to the Committee. Interim Manager Hopkins also reported the Legislation received public comment support from San Joaquin County, South San Joaquin Irrigation District and the California Special District Association and reported the Committee voted 6-0 to pass it through.

- b. ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting, 06/10/22

Interim Manager Hopkins attended the June 10, 2022 ACWA State Legislative Committee Meeting. Interim Manager Hopkins reported primary discussions focused on 2 bills AB1717, classifying forest fuel reduction as prevailing wage. Interim Manager Hopkins reported ACWA staff is proposing to change the position from “proposed unless amended” to “watch” out of concern that if they oppose, it could impact labor organization support for dam safety money. Interim Manager Hopkins reported other discussions focused on SB1205 that would require the State Water Resource Control Board (SWRCB) to require climate change as part of Water Availability Analysis (WAA) that is part of water right application(s), emphasizing as currently written, the Legislation would grant SWRCB authority to require existing water rights be revised so that they incorporate impacts from climate change. Legal Counsel Zolezzi reported the language was amended for future water rights. Interim Manager Hopkins reported since these bills just went to Committee, ACWA scheduled a special State Legislative Committee Meeting on June 20th to discuss SB1205, SB1157 – Reducing indoor water use to 42 gallons/per person daily and AB2201 – Executive Order for GSAs authorizing Well Permitting becoming permanent. The next meeting is scheduled for June 20, 2022.

- c. Stockton Area Water Suppliers (SAWS) Meeting, 06/10/22

Interim Manager Hopkins attended the June 10, 2022 Stockton Area Water Suppliers (SAWS) meeting. Interim Manager Hopkins reported primary discussions focused on public outreach to promote conservation. The City of Stockton (COS) is taking an educational approach to the customers who are not meeting the upcoming conservation requirements and the COS will be presenting to City Council at the July 12th City Council Meeting for approval of additional outreach materials. Interim Manager Hopkins inquired on the conservation levels for each of the Urban Contractors and the COS did not have any figures however California Water Service (Cal Water) reported their demand year-over-year has increased and have not seen that conservation yet from the customers. Director McGaughey reported Cal Water has to do something more serious. Director Panizza commented Cal Water has imposed restrictions on outdoor watering to twice a week, effective May 22nd however, has not heard of the COS imposing similar restrictions. Interim Manager Hopkins reported the COS also has water restrictions in place however there is some confusion with their customers because in some locations Cal Water serves part of a block and the COS serves the other so the customers are confused when their neighbors are irrigating different days than they are, so the Urban Contractors are working on coordinating their efforts. The next meeting is scheduled for July 8, 2022.

d. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Interim Manager Hopkins provided a handout to the Board of a proposed Press Release to post to the District website to address the recent curtailment from the State. The District has received a lot of phone calls from customers who are confused about their ability to continue to pump our stored New Hogan water. Interim Manager Hopkins commented if there are no objections from the Board this will be posted so our customers have accurate information. President Watkins inquired if our water supply operators will let the irrigators know; and commented on changing the water order message. Interim Manager Hopkins replied yes, staff will inform our customers and staff will also revise the Ag Call-In message script.

Re: LLPS SCADA Implementation and OPS PLC upgrade

BACKGROUND:

In 2019, the District began a multi-year project to install a centralized Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) system.

Phase I saw the completion of the North Raw Water Project, the creation of server infrastructure with redundant SCADA visualization software, and the creation of District Standards such as PLC programming, control panel, and tag naming to assure uniformity in SCADA and IT projects. The District adopted High Performance Human Machine Interface (HMI) standards for our SCADA visualizations, and the first SCADA visualizations were created that controlled the Raw Water Project.

Phase II saw the replacement of legacy Filter PLC hardware with new redundant PLCs and new filter control panels. New SCADA visualizations for Filter Basin control were created, and all Filter processes were integrated into SCADA. Legacy Master Control Board (MCB) displays were decommissioned, and daily Filter Basin operations were controlled by SCADA.

Phase III saw the replacement of Legacy PLC hardware in the High Service Pump Station (HSPS), and the installation of new HSPS control panels. The HSPS legacy control narrative was extensively reviewed and modified to utilize the strengths of the SCADA environment. Extensive new SCADA visualizations were created to provide Treatment Plant overviews and HSPS control. A menu structure with navigation was put in place for Water Supply, and the first pilot water supply sites were able to display data in SCADA.

SUMMARY:

Phase IV.

The next area that needs to be addressed is the LLPS (Low Lift Pump Station) and the Operations PLC SCADA integration and programming. This contains 3 parts:

1. Ops PLC Interface Wiring and MCB Panel modifications to bring the ControlLogix PLC pair installed there up to recommended standards and to provide a solid platform for the integration of the Low Lift Pump Station in this FY 2022-2023, and signals remaining on

the MCB. Tasks include documentation of existing system, design, parts, cutover plans, installation and as-built drawings.

2. Ops PLC New Core Program. The existing program was originally created to run on a PLC5/25 in 1990. The District upgraded the original PLC5/25 to a PLC5/40E around the year 2000, and upgraded to a ControlLogix platform 10 to 12 years later. The program was subject to a 'Translation' program by Rockwell to allow it to run on the ControlLogix platform. The original program was poorly written by Tesco when first installed, and is completely inadequate now, and unable to make use of contemporary programming and standards. This part would include the creation of a new program designed to run on our ControlLogix platform, and SCADA integration. The above two activities should be considered foundational to all other PLC related activities on the East side, including integration of the planned Hypochlorite facility.
3. Low Lift Pump Station SCADA integration. This includes the design and installation of a new RIO rack in the LLPS, documentation of the existing system, a newly control strategy, programming and as-built documentation. Two existing VFDs will be integrated into SCADA, and one new VFD purchased for P3 will be integrated. Status from two emergency generators and a Low Lift electrical yard power quality monitor will also be included. It is anticipated that all legacy HMI devices remaining on the MCB, including the annunciator will be removed by the end of this phase.

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff recommends that the District authorize the General Manager to execute a contract with ControlPoint Engineering for the amount of \$634,094, plus a 5% contingency, for a total not to exceed amount of \$665,799, and make all other necessary approvals. Funding is available within the Water Treatment Plant SCADA account from FY 22-23 in the amount of \$805,000.

Fully funding the LLPS SCADA Implementation Project will require postponement of the Valve Structure 2 Automation Project and the WB1/WB2 SCADA project.

BACKGROUND

Stockton East Water District (District) maintains 17.5 miles of canal right of way, 9 miles of pipeline right of way, District property at Bellota Weir, and the District's Water Treatment Plant. District staff have identified our spray program to be the most effective means of vegetation control. Optimizing the vegetation maintenance and control program will improve efficiency, yield much more effective results, and reduce fire liability.

SUMMARY

The District owns one spray trailer. Staff has identified that our current spray trailer has needed structural repair to the frame, axle repair, as well as repair to the expected wear parts associated with normal use over 13 years. The application of herbicides cannot be completed in a timely fashion with only one sprayer shared between the treatment plant grounds and water supply system. The current approach results in the District missing the window of opportunity for ideal application. District staff recommends the purchase of a new spray rig for water supply operations. The Water Supply Department is now adequately staffed and licensed, enabling the District to benefit from timely application, improved vegetation control and reduction of potential habitat inducing growth on District property. Staff solicited three quotes and the lowest vendor was BG AGRI Linden for a cost of \$14,708.78, including all taxes/fees.

RECOMMENDATION

Staff recommends the Board of Directors authorize the Interim General Manager to approve the purchase of a 300-gallon elliptical road rated sprayer from BG AGRI Linden in the amount of \$14,708.78, plus 5% contingency, for a total cost of \$15,444.22, and make all other necessary approvals. Funding is available within the Fiscal Year 2022-2023 budget.

SEWD submits this formal request to the State Water Resources Control Board (**Board**) to reject the proposed order issued by the Administrative Hearing Office on January 27, 2022 in regard to water-right application A029657 (**Application**).

SEWD submits this request as a party interested in the ultimate disposition of the County of San Joaquin's (**County**) Application for a permit to appropriate water from the South Fork American River at the Freeport Regional Water Authority Facility on the Sacramento River. The Eastern San Joaquin Groundwater Basin is subject to critical conditions of overdraft; therefore, any and all sources of water supply to the Basin should be pursued. SEWD commends the County for pursuing this Application and exploring creative options for use of the water within the Basin.

Pursuant to that Notice of Transmittal of Proposed Order sent May 27, 2022, SEWD submits this formal written request to the Board to:

- (1) Reject the proposed order and decide the case upon the record or upon an agreed statement of the parties, with or without taking additional evidence.

In addition, SEWD requests that the Board grant the County additional time to pursue the Application, sufficient time to plan for use of the water, and preservation of its Application under the Watershed of Origin statute.

SUBJECT: Support for \$106 Million Budget Request for South Delta Channel Depth Restoration Project

Dear Governor Newsom, President Pro Tempore Atkins, and Speaker Rendon:

The undersigned organizations would like to express strong support for the proposed State Budget allocation requested by Assemblymembers Villapudua and Flora in their March 29, 2022 correspondence (attached). That request seeks a \$106M budget allocation for the purposes of furthering the South Delta Channel Depth Restoration Program, a joint effort begun by the South Delta Water Agency, the Central Delta Water Agency, the State Water Contractors, the San Luis & Delta-Mendota Water Authority, Westlands Water District, the SWRCB Delta Watermaster's Office, the California Department of Water Resources, the California Department of Fish and Wildlife, and the U.S. Bureau of Reclamation. The crucial nature of this effort is reflected by the interest of such a diverse group.

The channels of the southern Delta convey water to local agricultural and municipal users as well as being the hub for water conveyance for the Central Valley Project (CVP) and State Water Project (SWP), which supply water to tens of millions of urban users, millions of acres of agricultural lands, and managed wetlands of critical importance to migratory waterfowl on the Pacific Flyway. Additionally, the southern Delta is part of the migratory route for anadromous fish and provides habitat for numerous other fish and wildlife species, many of whom are endangered.

These channels are also important recreational and public trust assets that provide subsistence for economically depressed communities and support commercial and sport fishing industries. And, of course, the channels provide some of the most beautiful scenery in our Delta.

It has become clear that large amounts of silt are accumulating in the channels and threatening all of the above-listed beneficial uses in recent years. Some channels are now only a foot or two deep on the high tide, and this lost channel capacity decreases the amount of water that can move through the system. At times, local diverters cannot exercise their water rights, and the shallow channels inhibit the ability to move water to SWP and CVP contractors. At the same time, these shallow channels become stagnant, warm areas where contaminants collect and fish habitats disappear.

In addition, the south Delta channels are a key component in transporting the periodic high flows from the San Joaquin River through the Delta and into the San Francisco Bay. The reduced channel capacity means that more fresh water is required to avoid undue intrusion of salt from the ocean and to protect beneficial uses.

The only solution to this problem is to reestablish channel capacity. Increased channel capacity will restore normal and necessary hydro-dynamic and biological functions of this portion of the Delta. The above-referenced parties, along with other state and federal agencies and interest groups, have proactively invested local and State funds to develop a Planning Guide for the proposed dredging project. This Guide provides the basis on which to move forward to secure necessary permitting and complete the needed channel dredging. The project will create and restore significant amounts of habitat, including the reestablishment of miles of needed shallow water habitat.

State Budget funds are of vital importance to advance this much-needed project. In a time of many competing needs, this project not only joins typically adverse interests in a common effort but also goes a long way in addressing the State's obligations to advance the co-equal goals and supports the Governor's expressed intent to preserve and enhance the Delta. Therefore, we encourage your support to fully fund this \$106M request in the State's 2022-2023 Budget.
