President Atkins called the regular meeting to order at 12:30 p.m., and Director Sanguinetti led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Present at roll call at the District were Directors Atkins, Cortopassi, McGurk, Panizza, Sanguinetti and Watkins. Also present were Manager Hopkins, Assistant Manager Vega, Accountant Rangel, District Engineer Evensen, Senior Water Treatment Plant Operator Brothers, Administrative Clerk Rodriguez, Legal Counsel Selke and Consultant Barkett. Director McGaughey and Finance Director Ram were absent.

C. PUBLIC COMMENT

Jessica Ritter addressed the Board and introduced herself as a representative from SiteLogIQ. Ms. Ritter and her team visited Stockton East Water District (SEWD) and were investigating the District's electrical meters and verifying data being provided. Ms. Ritter will be returning and providing the District a preliminary proposal to advise the District on the current solar being used.

Director Atkins inquired on the expense on page 13, line item 29 and 30 for Holt of CA for Hosie Crossing Replacement-Rental of Cab/Air Dozer D6T/D6 in the amount of \$18,345.12 and Hosie Crossing Replacement prj. 2319-Rental of cab/air dozer in the amount of \$10,099.79. Assistant Manager Vega replied only one dozer was rented for the amount of \$18,345.12 and the second rental in the amount of \$10,099.79 was for the Hex Cab Air excavator being a different type of equipment.

Director Cortopassi inquired on the expenses for temporary staff working in Administration and offsite. Manager Hopkins replied part of the temporary staffing is due to workload, vacancies in the Administration department, and fitting the construction within the condensed time frame for the Hosie Project.

Director Panizza commented he was pleased with the report and the information presented to the Board.

5. Stockton East Water District – CDFA SWEEP Block Grant Administration and Funding Memo
Manager Hopkins provided the Board with a CDFA SWEEP Block Grant Administration and Funding Memo. Manager Hopkins reported Stockton East Water District (SEWD), North San Joaquin Water Conservation District (NSJWCD), and South San Joaquin Irrigation District (SSJID) were collectively awarded a \$5M Block Grant Award, which the District will subaward to growers within the three Districts to support new diversions for surface water and other on-farm improvements. Stockton East Water District is responsible for receiving the applications, setting up a schedule of reimbursement from CDFA, and distributing funds to the recipients. The grant reporting will be performed quarterly, and the funds will be reimbursed once the reporting is complete. Staff concluded the best solution involves Stockton East Water District (SEWD) moving \$1M from AG reserve funds to a restricted fund and administering it. The AG reserves will be reimbursed and replenished with the expensed amount every quarter. At completion of the grant

contract, Stockton East Water District (SEWD) will be made whole by transferring the \$1M back into AG reserves.

Director Watkins inquired if only Stockton East Water District (SEWD) customers will benefit from this funding or will North San Joaquin Irrigation District (NSJWCD) and South San Joaquin Irrigation District (SSJID) customers benefit as well. Manager Hopkins replied all three District's customers will benefit from this funding and an agreement will be implemented between the three Districts.

Director Atkins inquired if North San Joaquin Irrigation District (NSJWCD) and South San Joaquin Irrigation District (SSJID) are also moving \$1M from their AG reserve funds to a restricted fund or is Stockton East Water District (SEWD) responsible. Manager Hopkins replied no, the District is responsible since Stockton East Water District is the grant administrator.

Assistant Manager Vega reported the transfer is internal which means the funds set aside for this particular project will stay within an interest-bearing account until they are disbursed. Discussion followed.

A motion was moved and seconded to approve the General Manager to transfer \$1M of AG reserve funds into a new restricted fund. The new fund will be restricted to only recipient and SEWD reimbursement transactions of the SWEEP grant projects, as presented.

6. Resolution No. 23-24-13 – Authorization to File An Application With The San Joaquin Council of Governments For The 2024 Once Voice Program For Fiscal Year 2024, Execute Any Required Documents and Provide Delegation of Authority.

Manager Hopkins presented the Board with Resolution No. 23-24-13. Manager Hopkins reported each year the San Joaquin Council of Governments puts together a list of projects which are important to the larger community in San Joaquin County. Stockton East Water District (SEWD) participated in the annual trip to Washington D.C. earlier this year. The San Joaquin Council of Governments is now receiving applications for projects which will be included in the packet for the trip to Washington D.C. next year. Staff thinks the One Voice Program is an opportunity to pursue funding for the Bellota Project.

Director Watkins suggested including the full project cost in the resolution. Discussion followed.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Agricultural Operations Committee Meeting, 11/15/23

Director Cortopassi, Director Atkins, Director Watkins and Director Sanguinetti attended the Agricultural Operation Committee Meeting. Director Cortopassi reported Don Harper from Rock Creek Water District also attended the meeting and suggested selling water to Stockton East Water District (SEWD). Director Cortopassi also reported the AG Committee spoke about taking \$2.8M out of reserves to balance the AG part of the budget.

Director Watkins reported the pump station upgrade at Potter Creek will receive new fish screens and a new 12,000 gallon per minute pump for the AG irrigation season. Discussion followed.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 11/14/23

Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 176,850 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 239 cfs. There is 1,910,627 AF in storage at New Melones Reservoir. Current releases are set at 2 cfs. Current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River are set at 208 cfs and release to all water users are set at 0 cfs. The water treatment plant is currently processing 34 mgd. North Stockton is currently processing 9 mgd. South Stockton is currently processing 6 mgd. Cal Water is currently processing 21 mgd. The City of Stockton is currently processing 9 mgd. The wells have been shut down.

Director Cortopassi inquired if Goodwin Diversion release to Stanislaus River is always at a low release. Manager Hopkins replied the current release is what they need to meet the fish flows.

3. Report on General Manager Activities

a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins reported staff hosted U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service and National Marine Fisheries Service for a tour of the District's fish passage project on Calaveras River and Mormon Slough. The agencies' staff were very pleased with the completion of the Hosie Project and are looking forward to continued work on the George Watkins Low Water Crossing and the Bellota Project. Manager Hopkins reported he will be working with staff to begin quarterly meetings related to fish passage on Calaveras.

Manager Hopkins reported he attended a meeting with the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce to see if there is some nexus between Stockton East Water District (SEWD) and the Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce for public outreach on the Bellota project. Tim Quinn the Chief Executive Officer (CEO) from Greater Stockton Chamber of Commerce thought they could be of use and will speak to his staff and find out what their thoughts are on community outreach through the chamber. Manager Hopkins reported a pending meeting with San Joaquin Business Council and is awaiting a response from the San Joaquin Partnership for similar efforts.

Manager Hopkins reported he attended a meeting with North San Joaquin Water Conservation District (NSJWCD) and South San Joaquin Irrigation District (SSJID) to draft a well mitigation policy, which is something the Groundwater Authority is required to have in place by the end of

this year. Jennifer Spaletta created an outline in which attendees gave feedback on a draft policy and will be going out to a couple of stakeholders over the next few weeks.

4. Stockton East Water District Treatment Plant Update

Senior Water Treatment Plant Operator Brother's reported for the month of October 98 samples of E coli were collected and 0 were positive. Stockton East Water District treatment plant processed 3,996 AF, Cal Water processed 1,840 AF, City of Stockton processed 1,715 AF, City of Stockton Wells processed 42 AF, Cal Water and Diamond Walnut Wells processed 238 AF and the City of Stockton Treatment Plant processed 1,1290 AF

Re: Fleet Policy Actions – Proposed Vehicle Purchases and Budget Amendment

Background

On October 17, 2023, Stockton East Water District’s (District) Board of Directors (Board) approved the District’s Fleet Management Policy (Policy). The purpose of the Policy is to establish best practices and procedures for operating a responsive and cost-effective fleet management program, including guidelines for vehicle procurement and retirement.

The evaluation criteria for vehicle replacement and/or retirement per the Policy includes:

1. Expected useful life (based on miles/age)
2. Maintenance and repair costs
3. Reliability

Summary

Per the Fleet Management Policy criteria, the District’s Maintenance Manager evaluated all 26 vehicles in the District’s fleet. **Table 1** shows the results of the evaluation.

As can be seen in the evaluation matrix, and per the Policy, units 16,37,47,53,55,64, and 76 should be brought to the board for replacement and possible retirement. Additionally, the policy dictates units 36 and 49 be also brought before the Board for recommended replacement and possible retirement, based on the discretion and judgement of the Maintenance Manager. Since unit 76 is slated to be replaced in the upcoming fiscal year, it will be omitted from the financial impact and recommendation sections within this memorandum. Unit 53 is a high-ticket item and staff would like to take time to further analyze its evaluation and possible replacement before it presents it to the Board for replacement/retirement considerations. Two other vehicles, units 26 and 31 (dump and boom truck respectively), did not have a readily accessible market value. Therefore, additional work will have to be done to ascertain their value and complete their evaluation.

Financial Impact

District Staff investigated the cost of procuring replacement vehicles with appropriate vehicles for functionality and value. Below, in **Table 2**, are the costs of vehicles with required equipment, 4x4 (where applicable), and minimal upgrades. Per the recommendations of the CARB compliance ad-hoc committee, staff will shift away from F-250-sized and towards F-350-sized trucks for certain applications. Additionally, where viable, the District will downsize from F-150/250-sized trucks to light duty trucks (such as the Toyota Tacoma).

Therefore, a budget amendment such as the one presented in **Table 3** is required to facilitate the purchase of appropriate replacement vehicles.

The funds budgeted for 10-5162-0 Legal Fees Section 15 will not be used since the legal issue for which said funds were allocated has been resolved, while the 8-Mile Dam Project is delayed due to permitting requirements. The transfer will leave \$316,336 and \$152,360 in each account.

Recommendation

Staff respectfully recommends the Board:

1. Authorize the budget amendment delineated in Table 3.
2. Authorize the General Manager to purchase eight vehicles for a cost of up to \$427,596, as delineated in Table 2, and make all other necessary approvals.

The replaced vehicles will be presented before the Board at a future meeting to authorize disposal of surplus equipment.
