President Atkins called the regular meeting to order at 12:30 p.m., and Director Nakaue led the Pledge of Allegiance.

3. Cancellation of June 18, 2024, Stockton East Water District Regular Board Meeting

Manager Hopkins presented the Board with a Cancellation of June 18, 2024, Stockton East Water District Regular Board Meeting. Manager Hopkins reported staff overlooked the upcoming holiday on June 19th. Juneteenth is a District observed holiday which falls on a Wednesday. Manager Hopkins reported it is a tight turnaround since staff will have less than a day to prepare the agenda packet. Staff is recommending the Board consider cancelling the June 18th meeting. Manager Hopkins also advised the next regular meeting on June 25th would be administered by Assistant General Manager Vega, since Manager Hopkins will be attending the California Special Districts Association General Manager Summit.

E. COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. Eastern Water Alliance (EWA)/ DREAM Monitoring Committee Meeting, 06/06/24
Director Sanguinetti attended the Eastern Water Alliance (EWA)/ DREAM Monitoring Committee Meeting. Director Sanguinetti reported during this meeting there was no EWA Board quorum, but the DREAM committee did meet to update everyone on the Pilot Project. Director Sanguinetti reported during the meeting they discussed the East Bay Municipal Utility District (EBMUD) lessons learned and discussed how they should implement more monitoring wells. EBMUD is interested in developing a large-scale project, capable of providing 40,000-acre feet of stored water. Director Sanguinetti also reported EEBMUD) is moving into the second phase of the project, which is doing work to the pipeline and trying to find places to recharge. EBMUD was going to figure out how much land is needed for them to be able to do the recharge, they discussed either purchasing or renting land.
2. San Joaquin County and Delta Water Quality Coalition Steering Committee Meeting, 06/10/24
Director Atkins attended the San Joaquin County and Delta Water Quality Coalition Steering Committee Meeting via Zoom. Director Atkins reported the meeting was quick; the minutes were not able to be approved and there was no financial report. Director Atkins reported they sent out invoices to all the customers, but the invoices were 40 cents over. They were able to contact everyone who received an invoice and returned and corrected everything. Director Atkins also reported the coalition might be affected by people pulling out their crops and letting it go fallow, meaning they wouldn't have to pay fees for the following years. Director Atkins reported at least five percent of people in the area might pull out their crops but is still unsure.

F. REPORT OF GENERAL MANAGER

1. Water Supply Report as of 06/04/24

Manager Hopkins provided a handout of the Water Supply Report for information only that included storage, release, and production data collected from various sources as of midnight last night.

There is 232,134 AF in storage at New Hogan Reservoir. Current releases are set at 202 cfs. There is 2,103,495 AF in storage at New Melones Reservoir. Current releases are set at 2,119 cfs. The current release at Goodwin Dam to Stanislaus River is set at 855 cfs and release to all water users is set at 2,396 cfs. The District Water Treatment Plant (WTP) is currently processing 52 mgd. North Stockton is currently utilizing 13 mgd. South Stockton is currently using 9 mgd. Cal Water is currently utilizing 22 mgd. The City of Stockton WTP is currently processing 21 mgd.

3. Report on General Manager Activities
 - a. Stockton East Water District Activities Update

Manager Hopkins reported the San Joaquin County Registrar of Voters office reached out informing the District it is time to have a discussion regarding the 2024 general election.

Manager Hopkins reported at the June 25th Board Meeting, a resolution will come to the board, where the board will have to request election services from the Registrar of Voters

Manager Hopkins reported on some current legislative updates, starting with AB (Assembly Bill) 460 – Water Rights. Manager Hopkins reported ACWA (Association of California Water Agencies) was a big opponent of this legislation and this bill has now been tailored to only fines and penalty fees for violations. Manager Hopkins reported on AB 2557, which came on the radar last week from the California Special Districts Association (CSDA). This bill will create new reporting requirements for temporary support and temporary staff, including consultants. The CSDA is taking the opposed position, so staff will look more into this bill and send out a letter of opposition. Manager Hopkins also reported on AB 2149 on gate regulation. Manager Hopkins reported the author of this bill proposes to regulate gates for every entity. Manager Hopkins reported no public entity wants to permit all their gates and have them inspected and regulated. The CSDA is taking an opposed position, the District will most likely follow suit. Manager Hopkins reported on AB 2079 on the proposed legislation for not allowing agriculture wells, that it has died in committee. Manager Hopkins reported on AB 1337, a water rights bill from the previous year. The author had failed to get the traction to move this bill forward, which is some good news for the District.

Manager Hopkins reported the Bellota Pipeline is still leaking, since one of the repairs did not hold up. Staff are still trying to address the leak which was worked on last week. Manager Hopkins reported there is another leak at Peter's Pipeline, which looks like it might have been damaged with some equipment on a turnout. Manager Hopkins reported as long as the pipeline isn't too full the water won't leak. Manager Hopkins reported there is another leak at Potter Creek. The water is either short circuiting along the turnout pipeline or the gate is leaking and letting the water go to the turnout. Manager Hopkins reported this current leak is controlled for now but will be fully repaired after Peter's Pipeline has been fixed.

Director McGurk inquired if some of these leaks are included in the area being filmed. Manager Hopkins replied the leaks are not located within the filmed reaches of the pipelines.

Manager Hopkins reported he met with Natural Resources Conservation Services (NRCS) to discuss their Resources Conservation Partnership Program (RCPP). Manager Hopkins reported this program seems very promising and has \$1.5 billion in funding available and \$25 million project funding available. Staff will be preparing two proposals, one for a continuation of our SWEEP Block Grant Program, where the District funds directly to the growers to support surface water installations. The second proposal is tied to the Districts' Water Supply Enhancement Project to potentially provide funding for our pipelines off the Calaveras River, to bring surface water into the center of the foothill. Manager Hopkins reported the deadline for this program is July 2nd. Manager Hopkins inquired about whether we wanted to continue partnering with the other districts, specifically North San Joaquin Water Conservation District and South San Joaquin Irrigation District. Manager Hopkins believes it will help the District if we include Central San Joaquin Water Conservation District but uncertain if they will help growers get connected to surface water. With a \$25 million grant, a lot of surface water conversion projects can be done between the four districts.

Director Watkins inquired if it is going to be \$25 million per district or if it is the total for all four districts. Manager Hopkins replied the \$25 million is the total and the financial assistance is 75% of the \$25 million and then NRCS keeps the other 25% for technical assistance they provide. If all four districts applied together, we would share \$25 million.

Director McGurk inquired about where the funding started and which department in the federal government it came from. Manager Hopkins replied it came from the United States Department of Agriculture, and it came largely from the Inflation Reduction Act. Discussion followed. Board feedback was to only focus on an application from the District.

Manager Hopkins advised the Board he plans to take time off at the end of this month between June 26th and July 1st.

4. Stockton East Water District Engineering Update

Manager Hopkins provided the Board with an update on current Engineering projects. Manager Hopkins reported the new LLPS Pump P-1 was installed, staff are still waiting for the motor and the check valve to arrive. Manager Hopkins also reported the security gates and fencing are almost done; staff are working on the wiring on the New Water Lane gate. The staff is still searching for a new security consultant to visit the site and install card readers at the gates.

Re: High Service Pump Station Roof Replacement

Background

The Stockton East Water District's (District) High Service Pump Station (HSPS) roofing system is beyond its useful life and viable repairs. Over the past twenty years, our existing single-ply roof has suffered significant wear and tear, undergone various modifications, and received numerous patched repairs. These issues have led to leaks during rainstorms, directly impacting the pumps and motors. These leaks pose a serious risk to our equipment and compromise our ability to deliver water. To address this, staff included the HSPS Roof Replacement Project in the Fiscal Year (FY) 2024-2025 budget approved by the Board of Directors (Board) on December 12, 2023.

Summary

Staff contacted four roofing companies specializing in membrane roofing systems— Baker Roofing, Silverstone Roofing, Claudex Roofing, and Stoneridge Roofing. However, only two companies were willing and able to provide quotes: Stoneridge Roofing and Baker Roofing.

The scope of work requires the selected roofing company to restore the integrity of the roofing system, which involves: removal of the existing single-ply roof layer, comprehensive cleaning of the area, disposal of all debris, installation of the new hatches, a new 50-mil PVC Duro-last membrane, new plumbing pipe flashing, and proper ventilation for the membrane. Additionally, before the project commences, District staff will remove the 10-ton AC unit, which is undersized for cooling HSPS, beyond its useful life, and has a faulty control module.

In evaluating two vendors, as seen in **Table 1**. for installing a new membrane roof, we compared key factors, including warranty, cost, material quality, and the approach to removal and installation.

Stoneridge Roofing offered a comprehensive package at a total cost of \$94,500. This competitive price included removing and disposing of the existing roof. This approach

ensures a clean and solid foundation for the new roofing system, potentially extending its lifespan and performance.

On the other hand, Baker Roofings' proposal, priced at \$112,395, was significantly higher and did not cover removing the old roofing system. Instead, they suggested directly installing the new membrane roof over the existing one. While this method might offer some time savings, it could lead to potential issues in the future due to underlying roof conditions that remain unaddressed.

Overall, Stoneridge Roofing presents a more cost-effective and thorough solution, addressing immediate installation needs and long-term roof integrity. Additionally, the District utilized Stoneridge Roofing for the administrative building roof and staff is satisfied with the quality of their work.

Financial Impact

The FY 2024-2025 Budget includes \$137,500 for the HSPS roof replacement project. The proposed roofing project with Stoneridge Roofing is estimated to cost \$94,500 and said price plus a 10% contingency falls within the approved budget and our planned financial framework for the year. As previously mentioned, the price includes removing and disposing of the existing roof and installing the new membrane roof.

Recommendation

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors authorize the General Manager to approve a contract with Stoneridge Roofing for a price not to exceed \$94,500 plus a 10% contingency of \$9,450, for a total amount of \$103,950, and make all other necessary approvals.

Re: Consider Authorizing Refinancing of Bank of Stockton Loan

Background

Stockton East Water District (the District) secured debt to purchase the Bozzano property in July 2014. Per Water Code §74950, the District is required to renew the loan every five years. The loan was renewed in July 2019 with an interest rate of 3.95%. The current change of terms (documentation) fee is \$250, and the new interest rate is 5.75%.

Summary

The original loan amount was \$3,325,000, and the current principal balance is \$1,959,395.55. The current federal interest rate ranges from 5.25-5.5% while the new interest rate from Bank of Stockton is 5.75%. Staff also inquired about rates through Oppenheimer and found that the rate from Bank of Stockton was competitive. Additionally, the change in terms fee of \$250 was reasonable.

Financial Impact

To date, the District has paid \$2,221,309.53 towards the loan, and the current loan balance is \$1,959,395.55.

1. If the District maintains the current loan terms, the District will incur an additional cost of \$728,251.65, bringing the total repayment to \$2,949,561.18. By the end of the loan term, the District would still owe ~\$1,834,932.24. Should the District decide to pay off the loan in 2029, the total payments made by the District would be ~\$4,784,493.42. However, if the District pays off the loan this year, the total paid by the District would be \$4,076,658.45.
2. The Board approved a budget of \$3,000,000 for FY24-25 budget for the potential purchase of surface water from Oakdale Irrigation District and San Joaquin Irrigation District. Furthermore, two separate amendment requests totaling \$603,668 have been submitted for alternative uses, resulting in an available balance of \$2,396,332. The District possesses the capacity to clear the outstanding loan balance of \$1,959,395.55, consequently maintaining a surplus of \$436,936 for the FY24-25 budget period.

Recommendation

Staff recommends the Board authorize the General Manager to pay off the current Bank of Stockton loan utilizing the funds set aside for the water transfer and make all other necessary approvals. This action will result in a savings of \$707,834.97.

Re: Update to TUD Water Supply Contract Discussions with USBR

Background

The U.S. Bureau of Reclamation (USBR) performed outreach to potential in-basin water users from the New Melones unit of the Central Valley Project (CVP) to solicit interest in an Eastside Division CVP water supply. The only interested party is Tuolumne Utilities District (TUD), with a corresponding requested contract volume of six thousand acre-feet (TAF). Since the 6 TAF must be included within the current total allocation of 155 TAF, the volume must be reduced from existing Stockton East Water District (District) and Central San Joaquin Water Conservation District (Central) CVP supplies. Thankfully, no further adjustments to District or Central CVP supplies are expected.

USBR staff have been in contact with District staff and counsel to develop allocation reduction alternatives for the District. The following tables identify the latest proposal provided by the District for the USBR to consider.

- As currently provided within the District and Central CVP contracts, the districts would have available for use any unused portion of TUD's annual allocation.
- Prior studies/documents state that any new contract water must be taken from the District's allocation first and once all the District's allocation has been taken, then allocation can be taken from Central – Reid Roberts to research and provide documentation to support this.
- TUD will begin contributing towards the cost of FishBio studies on the Stanislaus River, as charged through the CVP water rate(s) and when TUD takes water.
- The USBR Shortage Policy be revised to provide 55 TAF of water supply in dry water years.

Next Steps

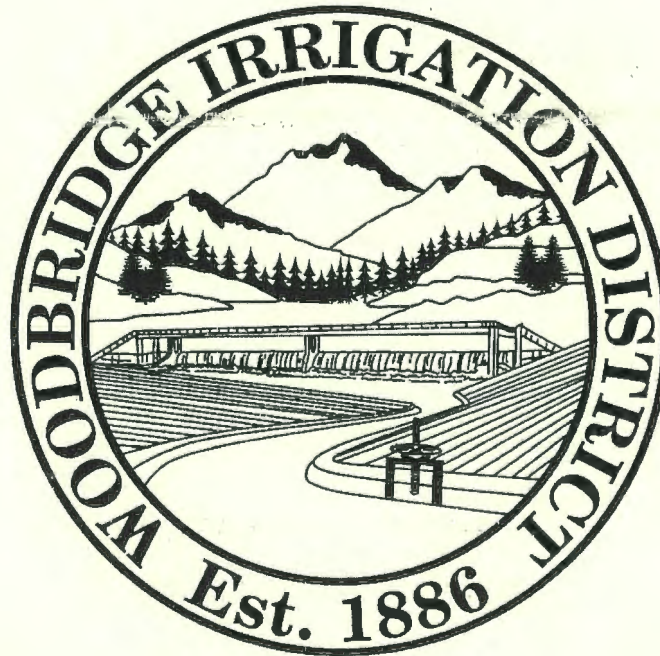

Dear Assembly Member Ortega,

The Stockton East Water District (SEWD) must respectfully oppose AB 2557, a bill related to contracting by local agencies. AB 2557 is overly burdensome and inflexible, which will likely result in worse outcomes for vulnerable communities and diminished local services for our residents.

Broad application has costly implications. SEWD relies, in part, on contractors to provide a variety of work and services. Given current workforce shortages, fluctuations in workload, widely varying duties, and a myriad of other influences, it would be difficult to provide all the unique knowledge and services required without the capable assistance from contractors and consultants. As a smaller organization, SEWD relies on contractors and consultants to help with design and construction of large projects, extraordinary maintenance, legal matters, and specialized services.

With the additional reporting obligations and requirements of AB 2557 for local agencies with represented workforces and their contractors, we can expect:

- (1) Fewer nonprofit providers, community-based organizations, and other private service providers willing to engage with local agencies
- (2) Exacerbated already-demanding workloads for our existing staff
- (3) Increased costs.

There remains a chronic under-investment in funding local government programs and services in California. Most of the new resources that local agencies have received from the state and federal governments over the past many years have been single occurrences.


Reporting requirements are burdensome, duplicative, and impractical. AB 2557 would require contractors to provide quarterly performance reports with a litany of required components, including personally identifiable information for its employees and subcontractors that is subject to the California Public Records Act. Districts would need to create a new local bureaucracy at a considerable cost to follow the provisions that require quarterly performance reports.

In addition to requiring contractors to provide semi-annual performance reports every 180 days, AB 2557 requires an independent auditor (likely also be subject to AB 2557) to determine whether performance standards are being met for contracts with terms exceeding two years, ostensibly at the contractor's cost. It is unclear what this audit could unearth that a regular performance report cannot. This provision fails to understand the practical logistics of achieving this reporting and review in a timely manner — not to mention the considerable burden placed on contractors, which would presumably be another deterrent to engaging with local agencies.

Making private employee data subject to the California Public Records Act deters effective partnerships with the private sector. AB 2557 requires contractors to provide information about employees and retain records. This private employee data would be accessible to any member of the public via the California Public Records Act (CPRA). Public employee data subject to the CPRA has resulted in data mining for profit, as well as subjecting employees to harassment and threats.

AB 2557 represents a sweeping change to the fundamental work of local governments, but we are unaware of a specific problem that this measure would address. AB 2557 will not improve services, reduce costs, or protect employees. For these reasons, the Stockton East Water District respectfully opposes AB 2557.
